SB13 Hong Kong Regional Conference

12 -13 September 2013

Urban Density & Sustainability

With the blessing from the Hong Kong Government, and organised by the Construction Industry Council and Hong Kong Green Building Council, the SB13 Hong Kong Regional Conference will be held on 12-13 September 2013 under the theme of "Urban Density & Sustainability".

The Conference aims to gather experts in the arena of sustainable built development to foster exchange of latest technology and knowledge from a holistic approach. It is to provide insights in balancing between urban growth and sustainable development. Various aspects are to be discussed including the impact of urban density on individual's livability and the city's economic growth; various town planning and social aspects including urban revitalisation, mega city and integrated design; government policies and visions; as well as latest innovations and labeling standards. Actual case studies on international and regional levels will also be covered.



2013 Policy Address Vs Green Building Development

HKGBC welcomes the proposals in the 2013 Policy Address with regard to the measures fostering environmental protections and promotions of green buildings. HKGBC believes that under the leadership of the Secretary for the Environment, the steering committee can handle the inter-departmental co-operation more efficiently and would be able to take a bold step forward to implement the promulgation of green buildings.

HKGBC has highlighted **3 areas** and wish the Government can deepen the corresponding policies in relation to **green building development:**





- 2) Apart from Kowloon East District, the Government should also implement the strategy of low carbon community and promote green buildings in other upcoming development projects, such as the North East New Territories New Development Areas.
- 3) HKGBC welcomes the Government to inject \$5 billion into the **Environment and Conservation Fund (ECF)** in principle. However, with the continuous increase of construction costs, making use of only the investment returns of the Fund to support green actions may hinder the construction sector to embrace energy saving and green measures. Therefore, HKGBC suggests that the Government should further increase the investment to the fund.

HKGBC will definitely spare no efforts to cooperate with the inter-departmental steering committee in the coming future, and continue to join hands with the Government and the general public to build a low-carbon and sustainable Hong Kong.

Collaboration with EKEO (Energizing Kowloon East Office)

HKGBC welcomes the collaboration with the EKEO under the Development Bureau to promote **green buildings** via a green map with green labelling system in EKEO's website, showing those buildings in Kowloon East which have obtained BEAM Plus Gold or above rating.

HK3030 Campaign
- A vision for a Low Carbon Sustainable Built **Environment in Hong Kong by 2030**

After three years' effort on driving the green building development, HKGBC believes it is the right time to define a roadmap on the long-term sustainable development in Hong Kong. With the increasing challenge of global climate change and surging electricity demand, HKGBC launched the HK3030 campaign in December 2012 and proposed a reduction of 30% of the absolute electricity consumption in buildings by 2030, as compared to 2005 baseline.





conference was held on 10 December 2012 and since then HKGBC is engaging various media to disseminate the message to the public.

This is a long-term campaign in guiding the market's transformation and HKGBC would be the driving body to lead the advocacy to the Government on policy changes; to mobilise the industry on adoption and advancement of green technologies; as well as to educate the general public on behavioural changes towards a low-carbon economy.
